School of Fish's FALL WALLEYE SCHOOL

School of Fish's FALL WALLEYE SCHOOL is a 2 1/2-hour class devoted to helping students become better walleye anglers during the fall season! Taught in a small group setting (class maximum is 30 participants) by Fishing the Midwest's television show host Mike Frisch, students will learn the basics of finding walleyes during fall. Included in that discussion will be instruction in the use of sonar and GPS technologies to help find walleyes. After fall walleye location is discussed, jigging, crankbait casting, and bottom bouncer presentations are taught. Jigs shine in deep and shallow water during fall, while bottom bounce presentations and crankbait casting techniques also put fall fish in the boat. Equipment choices for those presentations will be discussed and, class participants will be given detailed instruction on how to fish these presentations. The class will conclude with a question and answer session and, Mike will stick around until the last question is answered! Also, students get a presentation packet with class notes to keep and use for further reference. If you have ever wanted a hands-on walleye fishing class that cuts through the chase and will help you find and catch walleves in the waters you fish during fall, School of Fish's FALL WALLEYE SCHOOL is for you!







Early Childhood Screening

Is a careful, simple check of your child's growth... physical, developmental, and emotional. Early childhood screening helps us identify health and learning problems, and prevent them from becoming more serious.

All children must be screened prior to kindergarten. If your child is over the age of 3, he/she is eligible for screening. The ideal age for screening is when your child is between 3 and 4 years old.

Screening can detect possible learning or health concerns that can be addressed before the start of kindergarten.

10 Ways to Ease Your Child's Preschool Separation Anxiety (and Yours)

By Hope Reeves, New York Times

Never sneak out of the room. Your child won't be happy when he figures out you're gone. (I learned that teachers hate this tactic.)

Never make promises or bargains you can't keep. Don't say you'll be sitting on the bench outside if you won't.

Keep things stable. Don't introduce any other new thing into the routine.

Expect regression. Your child might be great the first week and drag her heels the second, or she might be completely potty trained but start having accidents.

Don't put words in her mouth. Don't say, "I know you hate school." Reflect instead: "I hear you saying you feel sad."

Connect with friends. Make a play date with a friend from class.

Remind your child that he is an expert at mastering new places. Say something like, "Remember how afraid you were of the zoo? Now you love it!"

Introduce your child to the school and new teachers before the first day. Take pictures of the front of the building, the teachers' faces and the new cubby, and show him a few times before school starts.

Let her take a small transitional object to school. Maybe a note from you or a stuffed animal (but not an absolute favorite; ask teachers).

Most of all, shake, shake, shake off the guilt.Your child will stop crying a lot sooner than you think.

They, you, we, all of us, will be fine.
